

# JULY 3 | SAINT THOMAS THE APOSTLE "MY LORD AND MY GOD"

he encounter between the risen Christ and a "Doubting Thomas" by the Italian sculptor Andrea del Verrocchio (unlike any other sculptor on the Orsanmichele), captured one of the most poignant narratives from John's Gospel: "Thomas, called Didymus, one of the Twelve, was not with them when Jesus came. So the other disciples said to him, 'We have seen the Lord.' But he said to them, 'Unless I see the mark of the nails in his hands and put my finger into the nail-marks and put my hand into his side, I will not believe." (John 20:24-25)

Verrocchio freezes the moment in bronze when Thomas reaches out toward Christ, his finger inches from the wound. Christ raises his arm and bares His side to allow Thomas to touch and see. In one of the most haunting expressions of Christ in the history of art, Jesus looks down at Thomas with both sadness and compassion. He understands Thomas' need to know but the words written along the hem of his garment reprove this doubt, "Have you come to believe because you have seen me? Blessed are those who have not seen and have believed." (John 20:29)

Emeritus Pope Benedict, then-Cardinal Ratzinger, wrote in "Introduction to Christianity" that this uncertainty, "this unceasing rivalry between doubt and belief" could draw believers and non-believers together and become an avenue of communication. "Doubt," he wrote, "prevents both from enjoying complete self-satisfaction; it opens up the believer to the doubter and the doubter to the believer." Ultimately it "saves both sides from being shut up in their own worlds."

# IMPORTANT DAYS OF THE MONTH

### Wednesday: 7/6/2019

#### St. Maria Goretti

Maria Goretti, an Italian peasant girl who was murdered on July 6, 1902, for refusing to give in to the wishes of Alessandro Serenelli, her neighbor. She is one of the youngest canonized saints in the Catholic Church and is the patron saint of teenage girls, and victims of rape.

### Saturday: 7/11/2019

#### St. Benedict

St. Benedict was born ca. 480 in Nursia, Italy. He is regarded as patriarch of Western Monasticism. Pope Paul VI announced him as the main patron saint of Europe on October 24, 1964.

## Sunday: 7/16/2019

#### **Our Lady of Mount Carmel**

Hermits lived on Mount Carmel in northern Israel in the 12th century. By the 13th century these hermit Carmelites became known as "Brothers of Our Lady of Mount Carmel."

## Sunday: 7/22/2019

#### St. Mary Magdalene

On June 10, 2016, the liturgical celebration honoring St. Mary Magdalene was raised from a memorial to a feast, putting her on par with the apostles.

## Sunday: 7/28/2019

#### St. Alphonsa

St. Alphonsa is the first person of Indian origin to be canonized as a saint by the Catholic Church and the first canonized saint of the Syro-Malabar Catholic Church.

#### MESSAGE FROM THE VICAR



Let us see the Risen Lord in the Eucharist and say with unwavering faith, "My Lord and My God!"

Dear brothers and sisters in Christ,

"Faith is to believe what you do not see; the reward of faith is to see what you believe."

– St. Augustine

St. Thomas the Apostle, who is our father in faith made what is certainly the most explicit statement of faith in the New Testament: "Yahweh Elohim" in Hebrew, which means "My Lord and My God!" (John 20:24-28). This is one of the most profound pronouncements of the Divinity of Jesus. This declaration of Jesus as God demonstrates the unconditional acceptance of St. Thomas in the Risen Lord. Instead of portraying Thomas for the lack of faith or being called as Doubting Thomas, St. John in his gospel presented Thomas as a man who desired nothing less than a personal encounter with the Risen Lord.

Just as Jesus had led Mary Magdalene on her journey to faith, so too would Jesus now lead Thomas to an unconditional faith. Mary Magdalene and the women were the first witnesses to the empty tomb and announced it to the disciples. So too did St. Thomas who enabled future generations to believe in the Resurrection of Jesus. This proclamation of appearance of the Risen Lord by St. Thomas has led all of us to a faith which is not dependent upon "seeing". In the gospel we see that St. Thomas was an Apostle who embraced the Risen Christ, so too were subsequent believers, since faith in the Lord was not purely dependent upon 'seeing'.

Our tradition and faith comes from St. Thomas who had both a personal encounter of divine Jesus and his unwavering faith in our Lord. This is what we experience in every Holy Qurbana. The Eucharistic experience Thomas had while he met the Risen Lord is what Church offers: the Risen Lord in every Holy Qurbana.

I invite you to have a deeper understanding of Thomas's proclamation and the ability to "see" the Risen Lord in the Eucharist and say with an unwavering faith, "My Lord and My God!"

### ST. ALPHONSA

AUGUST 19, 1910 - JULY 28, 1946

St. Alphonsa is the first Indian to be canonized as a saint by the Catholic Church and the first saint of the Syro-Malabar Catholic Church. She was born on August 19, 1910, at Kudamaloor to Joseph and Mary Muttathupadathu, and baptized with the name Anna.

Anna had lost her mother at a young age and was raised by her maternal aunt. Anna came from a rich family, so she received many marriage proposals from reputed families. Her foster mother wanted her to marry a rich man and become the perfect housewife.

After St. Theresa of Lisieux appeared and told her that she would become a saint, she realized that she wanted to dedicate her life to Jesus Christ. To avoid her foster mother's attempts of arranging a marriage for her, she intendedly fell into a pit of burning chaff, burning her foot in order to fulfill her will of becoming a religious sister instead. When it became possible, Anna joined the Franciscan Clarist Congregation of the Third Order of St. Francis at Bharananganam. On August 2, 1928, she took the name Alphonsa of the Immaculate Conception, in honor of St. Alphonsus.

Unfortunately, Alphonsa was gravely ill and was struck by pneumonia. After many serious health problems, she died on July 28, 1946. She came to love suffering because she loved the suffering Christ. She learned to love the Cross through her love of the crucified Lord.

Her tomb at Bharananganam has become a great center of pilgrimage and attract people from far and near. She is a patron against illness and her feast day is on July 28.



# DID ST. THOMAS **REALLY GO TO INDIA?**



The Catholic Church maintains a neutral stance on the proposition that Christianity might have been established in India long before it was in most of Europe. There is more evidence of St. Thomas's visit to India than anywhere else; in 1956 Pope Pius XII granted minor basilica status to San Thome Cathedral in Chennai.

Even if every other part of the St. Thomas story is one day proved to be false, there can be no doubting the incontrovertible links the St. Thomas Christians have with the Syrian Christianity. Churches in the southern Indian State of Kerala still use the liturgical Syriac language – a dialect of the Aramaic language spoken by Jesus and St. Thomas. Syria was the bedrock of early Christianity and an important part of the Roman empire, trading with southern India from the Red Sea. This was inevitable for the Romans, with their addiction to black pepper and knowledge of monsoon winds. Roman coins and other artifacts were also found in abundance in Kerala and Arikamedu in Puducherry.

At a time when the earliest Christian communities are being eradicated in the Middle East, their legacy at least lives on in India, thanks to St. Thomas. However, under the present political climate, Christians in India may face the same fate in the coming days.
