# **General Guidelines**

- 1) All registered students of St. Alphonsa SyroMalabar CCD School Baltimore are eligible to participate in the Faith Fest.
- 2) There are 4 different Categories for Solo Items. They are:-

Category 1 - Kids: Students of Pre-KG, KG, 1st and 2<sup>nd</sup> Grades

o Category 2 - Sub-Juniors: Students of 3<sup>rd</sup>, 4<sup>th</sup> and 5<sup>th</sup> Grades

Category 3 - Juniors: Students of 6<sup>th</sup>, 7<sup>th</sup> and 8<sup>th</sup> Grades

o Category 4 - Seniors: Students of 9<sup>th</sup>, 10<sup>th</sup>, 11<sup>th</sup> and 12<sup>th</sup> Grades

- 3) No differentiation will be made between genders within a Category.
- 4) Registration forms of all participants for Faith Fest 2021 should be submitted on or before January 24, 2021. No other form of registrations including Phone-in registrations will be allowed.
- 5) No registration form will be accepted after the deadline. Changes cannot be made after the deadline.
- 6) The Faith Fest participation fee will be \$10 per child. Students can participate any number of events. All Fees should be submitted along with the registration form. This fee is to cover the expenses of the event.
- 7) All participants should abide by the guidelines.
- 8) Participants can use English or Malayalam for their competition item.
- 9) All participants must dress and conduct themselves appropriately, in conformity with accepted standards of dress code and behavior in a Catholic Church.

- 12.5 The videos should be unedited, and without any tampering.

### 13 Grievance Resolution Policy

If a participant is not satisfied with any of the arrangements or results, then he/she should contact the Faith Fest 2021 coordinator. Only grievances regarding violations of policies as given in Faith Fest 2021 guidelines and clarifications given as applicable will be accepted by the grievance committee. Judges' scoring decisions are final and will not be discussed after the judgment results have been officially announced. A competition result may be overturned by the grievance committee based ONLY on policy violation complaints.

- The Grievance Resolution Committee (GRC) will consist of the following members: The GRC Chair (appointed by the Vicar), CCD Director, and Faith Fest 2021 Coordinator. Complaint should be made in writing at the Faith Fest 2021 coordinator within one hour after announcing the results of an event.
- 13.2 After careful consideration of the complaint, if the committee decides that the complaint does not merit a consideration, then the Faith Fest Coordinator will notify the complainant.
- 13.3 If a participant or his/her parent(s) makes a complaint against another participant, then the committee will carefully consider the complaint. If the committee decides that the complaint merits consideration, then the committee will invite the aggrieved party to be present during the deliberations. The complainant will also be required to attend the deliberations. The final decision of the committee is binding and cannot be challenged.

### 14 Time Limit Policy for Virtual Stage Events

- 14.1 Participants will not be disqualified if they exceed the maximum allotted time but will accumulate penalties.
- 14.2 Time clock will start when the first sound (whether instrument or voice) is heard in the video.
- 14.3 Time clock will stop when the last sound (whether instrument or voice) is heard in the video.

- 14.4 For all virtual stage events (except Family skit), a fifteen (15) second 'grace' period will be allowed after the allotted time with a minor penalty of up to a maximum one-half (0.5) points per judge.
- 14.5 For Family Skit, a two (2) minute 'grace' period will be allowed after the allotted time with a minor penalty of up- to a maximum one (1.0) point per judge.
- 14.6 For ALL events, after the 'grace' period, the penalty will be one (1) point per extra 10 seconds per judge.
- Judges will be asked to consider only the performance by the participant and assign the scores per each criteria; the time penalty will be calculated separately by a time keeper and levied from each judges' score sheet at the time of tabulation.
